


Next Months' Meeting

Members' Space

Forty Years ago in Cadillac History - 1957

Do you remember 1957? Elvis, James Dean, Marylin Monroe, Sock Hops, Rock 'n Roll, Drive-in Theaters, West Side Story, Sputnik. All these things were hits in 1957. Chevrolet introduced the car that would become a dream for a lot of folks these days, the '57 Chevy. Ford also had a great car that year in the Thunderbird. Who would have thought at the time that these cars would be so popular today?

Not to be out done, Cadillac Motor Car Division of General Motors introduced a new super luxury four-door sedan that would become one of the most collectable Caddys ever produced. Announced in December 1956, and released around March 1957, the Eldorado Brougham was a hand built, limited-edition, four-door hardtop sedan derived from the Park Avenue and Orleans show cars of 1953-54. Designed by Ed Glowacke, the Brougham featured America's first completely pillarless four-door body styling. Even ventipanes were absent. The Brougham was further distinguished by a brushed stainless steel roof, the first appearance of quad headlights and totally unique trim.

The exterior ornamentation included wide, ribbed lower rear quarter beauty panels (extending along the full rocker sills) and a rectangular sculptured side body 'cove' highlighted with five horizontal windsplits on the rear doors. Tail styling treatments followed the Eldorado theme and 'suicide' type hanging was used for the rear doors.

Standard equipment really did seem to include "the Kitchen sink" with all possible accessories such as: a dual four-barrel V8; air-suspension (the first of it's kind on any American production car); low-profile tires with thin whitewalls; automatic trunk-lid opener; automatic 'memory' seat; Cruise Control; high-pressure cooling system; polarized sunvisors; Signal-Seeking two speaker radio; electric antenna; automatic-release parking brake; electric door locks; dual heating system; automatic starter (with restart); Autronic Eye; drum-type electric clock; power windows; forged aluminum wheels; silver magnetized glove box drink tumblers; cigarette and tissue dispensers; lipstick and cologne; ladies compact with powder puff, comb, mirror and matching leather notebook; Arpege atomizer filled with Lanvin perfume; and, oh yea, air conditioning. Buyers of Broughams had a choice of 44 full leather interior trim combinations and could select such items as Mouton, Karakul or lambskin carpeting.

400 Broughams were produced in 1957 at a factory price of \$13,074 each. Cadillac would continue to offer the Brougham until 1960 when only 101 units were made. 1958 saw 304 units and 1959 saw 99 cars produced. Only 1957 and 1958 models were actually made in the United States. 1959 and 1960 bodies were made in Turin Italy by Pinan-Farina and shipped to America for assembly onto the chassis.

Some other interesting facts about the Brougham:


- The 1957 Eldorado Brougham was designed to compete with the Lincoln Continental Mark II.
- The new quad headlights were illegal in some states during 1957.
- The air-suspension system proved unreliable and Cadillac later released a kit to convert cars to rear coil spring type suspension. This makes Broughams with the air system intact rarer and more valuable today.
- Ball joint suspension was a new technical feature adopted this year.
- One Brougham was actually made in 1956 as a Town Car with an open drivers compartment. It appears on the cover of March 1996 Self Starter.

In some peoples' eyes 1957 was one of the greatest years ever for automobile designs. The 1957 Cadillac Eldorado Brougham certainly ranks as one of the very best of that year.
